The Richard Maxwell Prize for Translation and Translation Studies

A \$500 prize, open to any undergraduate student in Yale College, shall be awarded annually to the best Literary Translation or to the best essay in Translation Studies. "Literary Translation" encompasses all genres, so long as the chosen work is substantial, while "Translation Studies" is understood to include theoretical and historical questions involving language, culture, and medium. Submissions that combine actual translation and reflections on issues raised or exemplified by the process are welcome. Submissions must include: (1) a cover letter with basic information about the student's studies/major and about the context in which the essay/translation was written; (2) a translator's introduction describing the intellectual and historical context of the translated text, along with some consideration of its technical features; (3) a copy of the translated text(s) in the original language, as an appendix to your translation; (4) annotation, as deemed relevant, for literary translations. Please submit three hard copies of work to the Comparative Literature Department office by May 1, 2025, 12 noon. The prize will be presented along with other Comparative Literature prizes at the department's Spring reception in early May.

The Richard Maxwell prize for Translation and Translation Studies commemorates the scholarly and pedagogical legacy of Richard Maxwell (1948-2010), an exceptionally wide-ranging undergraduate teacher, scholar and critic. He was an historian of the novel, of visual culture, and of urban life, and a critic of poetry and film. During his final illness he dictated an experimental novel about architectural, literary, and film life in 1950s Los Angeles. Richard Maxwell believed deeply in the discipline of Comparative Literature and the ideal of world literature, and he championed his Yale students as aspiring translators, critics, and writers.

Yale Hub will remain open to convert full-term and second half-term Yale College courses to Credit/D/Fail until April 25. Attempts to convert courses offered in the first half of the term to Credit/D/Fail after 5 p.m. on February 26 will not be valid.

The Yale College Online Course Change Notice form is available on the <u>University Registrar's Office website</u> for students to request course withdrawals. This also includes late professional school course requests. The normal \$5 administrative fee will apply to all course withdrawals and late additions, including late adds due to instructor permission granted after add/drop period has closed.

If you wish to convert a Yale College course to Credit/D/Fail, take the following steps. Once you convert your grade mode to Credit/D/Fail it cannot be reversed.

- 1. Log into Yale Hub.
- 2. Select the Course Enrollment tab and click "Yale College Change Course from Letter Grade to Credit/D/Fail."
- 3. Change the drop-down selection from "YC Letter Grade" to "Credit/D/Fail."
- 4. Click "Submit Changes" to save the conversion.
- 5. A confirmation of the change will be sent to your University email account. If you do not receive the confirmation email, your change was not processed. You can confirm all of your course grading modes by viewing your "Course Schedule Details by Term" in Yale Hub.

25-26 Dwight Hall Community Mental Health Fellowship Applications are opening soon!



Yale Degree Audit

Yale Degree Audit is a web-based tool that calculates and displays how an individual student's courses may count toward the requirements for the bachelor's degree. The degree audit enables students to monitor their own progress toward the completion of degree requirements. It also helps students, and their advisers discuss course selection for current and future terms more meaningfully by clarifying what requirements the student still needs to complete. Log into Yale Hub to pull up your audit.

Unlike a transcript, your degree audit is an unofficial document provided for your information and convenience. The audit serves as a tool to provide you with helpful and timely information when you are planning your course schedule, discussing your schedule with your adviser, and reviewing your progress toward completing the requirements for the bachelor's degree. Your degree audit is **not** an official academic transcript.

Yale Degree Audit will help you:

- Determine what requirements you need to fulfill in order to complete your bachelor's degree.
- View a list of all courses in which you have enrolled and the distributional designations each course carries.
- View individual course grades and cumulative grade-point average (GPA)
